Dear Parents

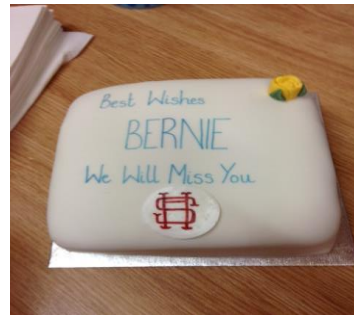
